Here are some suggested activities to do whilst you are at home during any snow days this session. You do not have to complete all of the activities each day. Can you think of any extra activities?

Suggested Activities

Outside Learning

- *Build a snowman and measure it using your hands, toys or natural objects e.g. a stick.*
- *Write your name, sounds, words and numbers in the snow.*
- *Fill three cups with snow. Put one outside, one in the fridge and one in the sink. Draw a picture of what happens.*
- *If the weather gets really cold go outside and blow some bubbles as high up as you can, watch what happens to them.*

Inside activities

- *Read a story and draw a picture of the front cover. Have a go at designing your own front cover.*
- *Make a paper snowflake*
- *Shape Hunt – look around your home for items that are different 2D or 3D shapes. Draw a picture of them.*
- *Exploring money – handling and recognising different coins and using 1p, 2p or 5p coins to make different amounts.*
