Here are some suggested activities to do whilst you are at home during any snow days this session. You do not have to complete all of the activities each day. Can you think of any extra activities?

Suggested Activities

Literacy

- Write a short poem about a winters' day using a range of imagery e.g. similes, metaphors and personification.
- Make a snowman and write/type step by step instructions, you could maybe even take photographs at each stage.
- Create a list of ambitious adjectives to describe snow and snowflakes then create a text snowflake using Text Snowflake Creator or Wordle.
- Draw a comic strip of what has happened in our class novel so far- 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas'.

Numeracy

- Times tables revision- speed tables, design a multiplication board game/matching bingo.
- Measure the snow fall each day and record your information in a table. Can you compare your results with another place and display your findings in bar or line graph?
- Make 3D shapes from snow and build a snow robot. How many different shapes have you used?
- Using a net, design and make a 3D Christmas decoration.
- Apply your understanding of tiling to create a new pattern for a Christmas jumper, can you make it symmetrical?

Health and Wellbeing

- Work with an adult to bake or cook a winter meal and then write out the recipe to share with your classmates e.g. soup, stew, cookies, scones.
- Design a warm up game to play during PE lesson

Expressive Arts

- Look outside your window and draw a winters' scene.
- Fill old plant sprayers with water and food colouring and go outside and create a snow picture.
- Design a new state of the art sledge- completed an annotated diagram.
