I hope you are all well and had a lovely summer break. We look forward to welcoming all children back to school on Tuesday 17th August.

As you will have seen from the First Minister's latest announcement, most of our COVID procedures and protocols will remain in place for the next 4-6 weeks.

What has changed?

Break time will be from 10.45 – 11.00am for all P1-7 children. Lunch time will remain staggered. P1-4 children will have lunch from 12.00 – 1.00pm and P5-7 children will have lunch from 12.30 – 1.30pm. Children do not need to remain strictly within their class bubbles so will once again be able to mix with friends from some other classes whilst in the playground.

This Term

A member of the Senior Leadership Team will be in each playground at the start of each day to oversee the children coming into school and ensure they know where to line up. Parents should drop children at the school gate and are not permitted to enter the school playground (the only exception to this is parents of nursery children). Advice for schools is that adults should maintain 1 metre distancing and continue to wear face coverings – we request that parents/carers follow this guidance at drop off and pick up too. Separate information already shared about nursery and P1 children starting nursery and school remains the same.

Last session, children did not bring school bags to school and for many of our children this worked very well. Given the circumstances, it remains our preference that children still do not bring a school bag to school however for some children a school bag may be helpful to carry their belongs and this is fine. In most circumstances, children should only need to bring to school

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- a water bottle (which should be taken home each day to be cleaned and refilled)
- a small snack
- packed lunch (if required)
- a pencil case if they wish

Children should not bring additional items (toys etc) to school. At the moment, children do not need to bring a PE kit to school.

Enhanced personal hygiene measures will continue and children will wash their hands when arriving in school in the morning and before they go home in the afternoon, before and after eating at break and lunch, and after using the toilet.

School Uniform

All children in P1 to P7 are expected to wear school uniform. School uniform is an important part of promoting and maintaining a sense of identity. Our school uniform consists of -

- dark grey trousers/skirt/shorts/dresses/pinafores
- red gingham dresses
- white shirt/polo shirt
- red sweatshirt/jumper/cardigan

If purchasing school uniform is a financial challenge in any way, please remember that we have a selection of pre-worn school uniform in school. This has been washed and we are very happy to distribute this as required. Please get in touch with us if we can help in any way.

Children will be outside at break and lunch in all but the wettest of weathers and for learning outdoors so please ensure your child is always dressed appropriately for the weather.
