This Term's Learning

Pupils will-

LITERACY: (L&T) - learn a Scots poem and develop confidence to perform it in class. All pupils are welcome to enter our annual Scots poetry competition, if they wish.

READING: continue to develop fluency and reading comprehension skills in guided reading activities. Later this term, we will start a new class novel, The Wild Robot, by Peter Brown.

WRITING: develop knowedge of grammar and common spelling rules through weekly teacher input and activities. We continue to use Talk for Writing to develop pupil confidence and writing skills.

NUMERACY: extend their knowledge of subtraction and division strategies, (mental and written), and use to solve word problems. They will develop their understanding of fractions, decimal fractions and percentages and use concerete materials to problem solve.

TOPIC MATHS: progress their knowledge of 2D and 3D SHAPE, using correct vocabulary and identify nets of 3D objects. TIME - pupils will develop confidence to read analogue and digital clocks. They will read timetables accurately and use information to plan journeys.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING: learn to name different parts of their body and describe the changes that take place in puberty using RSHP resource. Linking to Safer Internet Day, they will continue to learn how to keep themselves safe online. PE: partipate in a range of activities to develop their skills for target games and throwing and fielding.

FRENCH: learn to say where they live, describe their family and pets. GERMAN: learn basic vocabulary and confidence to have short conversations, (greetings, introducing self and saying age, counting to 100 etc)

TOPIC: learn to locate key Scottish towns and cities on a map and develop knowledge of maps to understand landscape and its use. Pupils are developing knowledge of Robert Louis Stevenson's famous pirate novel, Treasure Island, through short video animations.
