On the morning of World Book Day, children will have the opportunity to watch a video of various school staff reading a short section of a book while wearing a mask. Children can guess who the school staff are before the big reveal in the afternoon! For P1-3, the Masked Reader event will be held in classrooms and for P4-7 this will be on Google Classroom.
